"Tour of Florida".....

Have you done it yet? Neither had I until recently. We call this "The Emerald Track". Why? You might ask. Because the thread on the patch highlighting the route is "Emerald Green". Duh...... In all reality, we plan at least 2 other tours and they should be called something right? Hindsight being 20/20, this one could easily have been called "The 900". In our newsletter, it states 868 miles. I decided to find out for myself if that was accurate so on October 24th. I left my house and got onto 75 South. First stop or first corner was in Naples at 8:55 AM. Note: *In order to qualify for a patch, we need gas receipts at all 4 corners.* There's a McDonald's next to the gas station so I figured to have breakfast prior to heading out on "Alligator Alley". (My toll receipt is stamped at 9:17 AM) One thing I noticed, "The Glades" are filled and brimming to the top with water. Towards the end of "The Alley", one can, I believe, take 595 to 95 but, not me, right to the end of "The Alley" that actually becomes the Florida Turnpike and dumps you right into South Miami. Let me just say, take the hassle out of it and go 595.

I now turn the **second corner** and start heading north on 95, the trip's longest stretch. Yup, Race Trac #491 in Pembroke Park, FL. Time stamp: 11:08 AM. Hurricane **"Sandy"** is off the coast and I can feel her cross winds blow. She's dumped a few storms on me as I came across **"The Alley"** and southern most sections of 95 but the waterproof **"Switchback"** jacket, **"FXRG"** waterproof pants and **Harley-Davidson "Lynx"** waterproof boots kept me nice and dry. Note: *The jacket and pants also have built in armor.* As I'm riding along, I start thinking about when I left my driveway. As you're all aware, a trip starts with a **destination.** This was no different except my destination was **home!** This is a concept non-riders cannot possibly understand. You leave home, to go home, don't fiddle around and arrive 15 hours later. How do you explain this to a non-rider? Easy: **"If I need to explain, you won't understand."** I think that pretty much covers it.

My third gas stop was in W. Melbourne, FL. Race Trac #456. Time stamp: 13:39 or 2:39 PM. As I was hydrating at this stop, a voice from the fuelling area perforates my thoughts: "Sir.....Sir, can you help me?" "Now what?" I said to self as I began to look around. A woman with a "caravan" type vehicle standing near a fully opened rear passenger side door was motioning to me for some assistance. Always being vigilant, I assessed the area for occupants or other individuals only to find a young lad in a car seat. Seemingly in a slight panic, the woman says to me: "I'm new to this car seat and I hooked him (child) in wrong. He's in pain and I haven't the strength to undo it!" I leaned in the vehicle, the woman pushed me in, and had her way with me..... end of story." Oops, fine line between what's real and what isn't. As I was saying:I leaned into the vehicle and said to the boy while trying to assess the situation: "What's up buddy? Are you OK?" The buckle was real tight and right up against his privates and he responds: "My wee-wee hurts!" I grab the buckle, latch or whatever this thing is that all straps plug into to see how to undo it and good grief was it tight! The little boy says: "That doesn't hurt my wee-wee." Feeling really set up right now, I look at the boy and say: "Listen. I'm here to help you. Do you want me to help?" He responds. "Yes." So, I follow up with: "OK, but I don't want to hear any more about your wee-wee and I'll have you out in a jiffy OK?" He agreed and I grabbed the buckle pulled it straight back with about 100 lbs. of torque causing the sides of the car seat to cave in so I could turn the buckle over and attempt to disconnect the straps. The lady had put the straps in upside down being the main reason she couldn't activate the release. The tyke is freed from the seat that imprisoned him and as I was walking back to my bike, I couldn't help but notice all the security cameras. Can you only imagine what images those cameras took? "Extra, Extra! Read all about it! Man assaults toddler at Race Trac!" Could not wait to get back on the road!

Finally, I make the third corner onto Rte. 10 and stop for gas in Jacksonville, FL. Race Trac #839. Time stamp 4:28 PM. Now heading west and although the sun is in my eyes I decide to ride on a bit farther in order to get away from some of the Jacksonville rush hour traffic. It's not as though there's a shortage of McDonalds on the road. Half way across Rte.10 I pulled over for supper. As with breakfast, I take the opportunity to make a couple phone calls and text messages and then it's back on the road. Darkness is rolling in as I make my final turn at corner number four. Supper was not that long ago, I've got plenty of fuel and I violate my own rule of fueling up at every corner. (at times, it's good to be the King) My last fuel up is at the Sunoco #2507. This is at exit #314 in Bushnell, FL. Time stamp: 20:03 or 8:03 PM. Ride into my driveway at 10:23 PM just under 15 hours when I left it 904 miles earlier. The ride was uneventful and a piece of cake.

Our **Key West** lunch ride is way more exhausting, fewer miles and more hours. If you are interested, we have a disclaimer sheet with instructions. We have patches for **only** those that complete this track. There will be at least 2 more **Florida Tours** added in the near future. One such Tour will be "**The Hour Glass**". Hard to say without actually measuring it but it should also qualify for Hard Butts 1,000 mile "**Butt Burner**" ride. The other Tour will be "**The Extreme**". This will be an over-nighter and include the destinations of **Key West** and **Pensacola**.

P & A Spotlight

Safety is not an accident.....

This month I would like to discuss something we all should be taking seriously: safety. Specifically, tires. Those who ride with me know I'm harder than most on the rubber that keeps me in touch with the road. The single link to our safety comes in the form of a contact patch that is roughly the size of two silver dollars. A tiny thing indeed when we consider that at "posted speed limits" we count on this to keep our bikes (that range in weight from 650 to 900 pounds), and the rider safe from a slide. In my case we're talking about a couple of hundred pounds of me, and an UItra Classic. Do the math and it comes in greater than a half ton. Let's think a bit about what we're asking from our tires. Motorcycle tires have been developed to constantly perform one duty on the road; "stick to it"; no matter the condition. Cold, hot, wet, dry, slow, fast, straight or a hard lean. The Motor Company, in conjunction with its suppliers, is constantly testing and will only put its stamp of approval on certain manufactures. Currently they are Dunlop and Michelin.

The contact patch we talk about is completely dependent on the tire being set to the correct pressure. These numbers are "tunable". A couple of psi will make a profound difference with the contact patch, its overall grip and roadholding capability of our tires. We should also consider what is in every one of our owner's manuals: "Set the tires for the load we put on our bikes and pay attention to them!" How often do we check our PSI? The "book" says: "Every time we get on the bike." Well maybe that's a bit of overkill, or maybe not if the bike only gets the week-end ride every other week. All tires will lose a bit of air, the bead, tube, and the physics of air will cause a couple of PSI to bleed off. This is normal and PSI needs to be checked frequently. Recently, I was up on the highway and things got a little "squirrely" at just above the speed limit. When I checked I was down 6 psi. That small difference made me come off the throttle. I'm lucky it wasn't raining. Nor did I have to deal with cross winds or the pull from a semi we're all too familiar with. So many things could have gone wrong. Once safely in my garage, I also checked my tires for cracks, dry rot and thread depth. My rear tire was below 4/32nd. Not cool. I'll need to change that out and soon.

In a nutshell, research and development is what makes us safe and no one does it better than Harley. Companies hire quality engineers and spend a ton of dough testing to make sure this is the right tire for that model, etc. The testing, which is published by the manufacturer for the tire, proves the amount of time and effort that go into making a safe tire that will have good wear, good traction, and the correct **contact patch** for the particular model, taking into consideration weight, thrust, and load being put on the tire.

The technology gained thru real world data and racing give manufactures like H.D. and Dunlop the definitive edge on what will work for our bikes. Most aftermarket companies won't put the money and time into proving their product will have similar load, wear, and safety characteristics. Coming on strong in this arena is Michelin, another great manufacturing company that is a player in the world of racing, research and development, currently manufacturing tires for the new Harley's.

Next time you think your \$60.00 tire is a bargain, ask yourself: "Is there actual engineering behind this tire or is it a Chinese clone?" You get what you pay for. **Cheap can get you killed**.

Another safety issue is lighting. Be seen, be heard. Isn't that what they say? Harley has some awesome new products related to that. Stop by and see Harley's new L.E.D. tail lights and signals. They'll let those **"biker killers"** texting or talking on their cell phone know you're in front of them for sure. While on the subject of lighting, have you seen the new L.E.D. head lights? Incredible amount of light comes from these new lamps. They even project a bright white light on a wall during daylight! They are so much brighter at night that it's hard to believe they're legal!

So hey, come on by, we'll check your tires and show you the new lighting displays.


